They live with me as family members, laying on the couch and roaming freely within the household. The challenge for me is to train in such a way that they look forward to working with me. I have learned to except that they are dogs and will make mistakes but now I see both my dogs and myself as "A WORK IN PROGRESS".

My approach toward helping other people always starts with obtaining a better understanding of their personal goals with their dogs. Once I understand their specific goals I can create a program and series of exercises that will help them strengthen these areas.

In the seminar I will try to cover concerns that the participants have listed on their pre-mailed questionnaires. Through the working slots I will try and show how to get and maintain a higher level of connection and communication.

With a Large group of people it can become impossible to cover everything but using my questionnaire I can see if the group has similar interests, below are some of the subjects I have covered in past seminars. These are listed just as food for thought and areas we may or may not choose to cover.

Attention:

What is it really? How do you get it? How do you keep it?

Show stress:

Where does it come from? Why do dogs work differently in show than in training? What can be done about it?

Exercises:

How I teach them and how to avoid many of the most common mistakes.

Leadership / Relationship:

We hear these terms used often but I will work to show you how they are expressed in the day-to-day living and working with our dogs.
